### The Opening Tip

The final week of 2011 coincides with the start of conference play for Stanford (10-2, 0-0 Pac-12), which hosts UCLA (7-5, 0-0 Pac-12) on Thursday night in the Pac-12 opener for both teams. Stanford is looking to bounce back from only its second loss of the year while UCLA has won five in a row following a 2-5 start.

In just his first three seasons as a head coach at any level, Johnny Dawkins continues to make an impact on one of college basketball's most accomplished programs.

Dawkins' contributions since arriving on The Farm have come in the form of both team and individual successes. One year after leading Stanford to a 20-win season for the 20th time in school history, Dawkins oversaw Landry Fields' progression from key reserve to all-league performer and eventual NBA Draft pick.

Dawkins has also made noticeable strides off the court, as evidenced by the addition of a top-20 recruiting class two years ago and last season's signing of Gatorade Illinois Player of the Year Chasson Randle.

The Cardinal wrapped up the 2010-11 season at 15-16. Fielding a team without a senior for the first time in school history, Dawkins put his rookies in a position to excel, with Anthony Brown and Dwight Powell earning Pac-10 All-Freshman Team honors. In fact, Stanford was represented with four all-league picks.

Stanford finished 14-18 during the 2009-10 campaign in Dawkins' second season at the helm. Working with a roster that featured only seven true scholarship players, two returning starters and six walk-ons, the Cardinal reached the Pac-10 Tournament semifinals.

Under Dawkins' guidance, Fields produced one of the most memorable seasons in school history, earning All-Pac-10 First Team honors after leading the conference in scoring, minutes played, 20-point games and double-doubles while finishing second in rebounding. He was chosen in the second round of the 2010 NBA Draft, as the 39th overall pick by the New York Knicks to become Stanford's 31st NBA/ABA Draft choice and first since Brook Lopez and Robin Lopez in 2008.

During his rookie season in 2008-09, Dawkins directed Stanford to a 20-14 record and reached the CBI semifinals, extending the program's lengthy streaks of consecutive winning seasons (16) and postseason appearances (16). In addition to surpassing Robert Burnett as the winningest first-year head coach in school history, Dawkins ranked third in victories among the 21 first-year head coaches in Division I with no prior college head coaching experience.

Dawkins, 48, became Stanford's 17th head coach on Apr. 28, 2009, after completing 11 years as a member of the Duke coaching staff. For the previous nine seasons (2000-08), Dawkins served as Duke's associate head coach and began his coaching career as an assistant in 1998-99. During Dawkins' 11 years as a coach at Duke, the Blue Devils won a national championship in 2001, six ACC regular season championships and seven ACC Tournament titles.

Dawkins finished his career in 1986 as the school's all-time leading scorer. Dawkins was a two-time first team All-ACC performer in 1985 and 1986 as well as the school's first consensus two-time, first team All-American. During his senior year, he was tabbed ACC Tournament MVP while also becoming the first Naismith Player of the Year recipient in school history.

### Scouting UCLA

- UCLA (7-5, 0-0 Pac-12) has reeled off five consecutive wins following a 2-5 start to the season that included home losses to Loyola Marymount and Middle Tennessee State.
- Picked to win the conference in the preseason media poll, UCLA will be playing its first true road game on Thursday. The Bruins are 6-3 at home this year.
- UCLA defeated Richmond 71-63 on Dec. 23 in its most recent contest.
- The Bruins are averaging 69.6 points and 35.7 rebounds per game while leading the Pac-12 in assist/turnover ratio (1.3). Opponents are averaging 63.0 points and 32.7 rebounds.
- Watch out for: Lazeric Jones (13.3 ppg, 3.8 rpg, 25 steals, 45 assists), Travis Wear (10.5 ppg), Josh Smith (9.6 ppg, 5.5 rpg, 56.0 percent FG) and David Wear (8.7 ppg, 6.1 rpg).

### Stanford All-Time vs. UCLA

UCLA owns a 135-90 edge in the series, which dates back to the 1924-25 campaign. The Bruins have won three in a row and nine of the last 10 overall. UCLA swept both meetings last year, winning 68-57 at Pauley Pavilion and 69-65 at Maples Pavilion. Stanford's most recent victory in the series was a 70-59 home win back on Jan. 9, 2010.

### Who To Watch Against UCLA

Josh Owens is averaging 11.7 points and 5.5 rebounds per game in four meetings while connecting on 18-26 tries from the floor. Jarrett Mann has averaged 5.0 points and 4.4 assists in five career games. Anthony Brown tallied 29 points and five three-pointers over two contests combined last year as a rookie.

### Scouting USC

- USC (5-8, 0-0 Pac-12) will play at California on Thursday before battling Stanford on Saturday. The Trojans have dropped four of their last five overall heading into Pac-12 play.
- Picked to finish seventh in the Pac-12 preseason media poll, USC has won back-to-back games just once this year and is 2-3 away from the Galen Center.
- USC has recorded only one victory since Nov. 30, routing TCU 83-59 on Dec. 19.
- Defense has been key, with USC allowing a league-best 56.0 points per game while foes shoot only 39.4 percent. But USC averages only 55.8 points and 29.3 rebounds per game.
- Be sure to watch: Maurice Jones (14.9 ppg, team-best 26 three-pointers, 50 assists), Aaron Fuller (11.9 ppg, 6.8 rpg, 52.8 percent FG) and Dewayne Dedmon (7.0 ppg, 5.5 rpg).

### Stanford All-Time vs. USC

USC leads the all-time series at 121-118. USC has won three in a row and seven of the last 10 meetings overall. The Trojans won both of last year's meetings by double-digit margins, after the series had been split for the previous five seasons. USC's 69-53 victory at Maples Pavilion last year was its first on The Farm since Feb. 21, 2002.

### Who To Watch Against USC

In five career games, Josh Owens has averaged 5.2 points and 5.8 rebounds. Josh Huestis averaged 8.5 points in two games last year, including a career-high 11 points in the second meeting. Andrew Zimmermann's 12 points are his most against any league opponent. Meanwhile, Jarrett Mann is just 1-18 from the field with seven points in six career matchups.

### Stanford In Conference Openers

Stanford is 4-6 in conference openers over the last 10 seasons. The Cardinal defeated Cal 82-66 at Maples Pavilion in last year's Pac-10 lid-lifter, earning its first victory in a league opener since topping Arizona State 71-60 on Dec. 28, 2006. Since the 1978-79 campaign, Stanford owns a 17-16 mark in conference openers (12-6 at home and 5-10 on the road).

### Takeaways From The Butler Game

- Josh Owens scored 17 points and grabbed nine rebounds. Owens has scored in double figures four straight games and 10 overall to pace the Cardinal.
- Stanford led 31-26 at halftime and outshot Butler 49.0 percent to 46.4 percent. But the Cardinal was outrebounded 34-29, committed 17 turnovers and made 13-21 free throws.
- The game featured 12 lead changes and five ties.
- Chasson Randle missed his first free throw attempt of the game, snapping a streak of 14 consecutive made free throws dating back to Nov. 23 against Oklahoma State.
- John Gage added a career-high 12 points off the bench, making 4-5 from the field and 3-5 from three-point territory. Not bad for 11 minutes of playing time.
- Josh Huestis entered the game having made only four turnovers in 225 minutes. However, Huestis finished with three turnovers in 13 minutes against Butler.
- Butler made 10 three-pointers, the most for a Stanford opponent since Oklahoma State nailed 11 triples on Dec. 21, 2010.
- Stanford has now made at least one three-pointer in 330 consecutive games, dating back to a 0-6 performance against Purdue in the John Wooden Tradition on Nov. 24, 2001.
- Stanford had its 15-game non-conference winning streak snapped. The Cardinal hadn't lost at home outside of league play since a 71-70 defeat to Oklahoma State on Dec. 16, 2009.

### Knee Injury Sidelines Harris For Season

Head coach Johnny Dawkins announced Thursday that junior guard Gabriel Harris will miss the remainder of this year after undergoing surgery Monday for an injury to his right knee. In 12 games off the bench, Harris was averaging 3.6 points and 2.0 rebounds in 13.5 minutes.

### Non-Conference Success

Stanford is 37-12 record against non-conference opponents under head coach Johnny Dawkins. The Cardinal wrapped up non-conference play this year with a 10-2 mark, its highest win total in such games since finishing 13-0 against non-league foes during the 2008-09 campaign.

### Suddenly In The Groove

Used initially this year as one of the first players off the bench, Brown's production in five December games nearly equals the output of his first seven games in November.

Stanford is 58-17 at home since the start of the 2007-08 campaign. The Cardinal was 11-5 at home last year, reaching the 10-win mark at Maples Pavilion for the 18th straight year. Stanford needs only three more victories at home this year to reach that benchmark.

### Winning Often, Winning Big

Stanford has made a habit of dominating its opponents in the early going, with the Cardinal boasting a scoring margin of +16.7 that ranks second in the Pac-12. Nine of Stanford's 10 victories have come by double digits, while five have been decided by at least 20 points.

### Stingy Defense Setting The Tone

Stanford has allowed only 57.3 points per game, a figure that ranks second in the Pac-12 and 15th in the nation. The Cardinal has limited eight of its first 12 opponents to under 60 points. In fact, it's really been a challenge for the opposition to score from anywhere on the court, as Stanford's foes are shooting 39.9 percent from the field, 32.8 percent from beyond the arc and 61.7 percent from the foul line.

### Winning The Rebound Battle

Stanford has owned a commanding edge on the glass, averaging 38.1 rebounds per game compared to just 29.8 by its opponents. The Cardinal ranked ninth nationally in rebounding margin entering last week. Six different players are averaging at least 3.0 rebounds, with Josh Owens grabbing a team-high 5.4 per game. Stanford has been outrebounded only twice so far.

### Plenty Of Minutes To Go Around

Head coach Johnny Dawkins has the benefit of employing a rotation that can consistently run 10-12 players deep. Nine players are averaging at least 10.0 minutes of court time, and it could be a couple more if John Gage (9.6) and Jack Trotter (8.4) increase their playing time.

### Scoring Should Be Balanced

Ten different players have notched double-digit scoring performances through the first 11 games. That's already equal to last year, when 10 players reached double figures in scoring at least once for the entire season. Five players scored in double figures during each of Stanford's first two games, representing the first time at least five players scored in double figures in back-to-back games since the first two contests of the 2007-08 campaign.

### Aggressiveness Resulting In Line Opportunities

Stanford has attempted 288 free throws compared to 183 by its opponents. However, the Cardinal has made only 194 of those freebies, translating into a 67.8 percent clip from the charity stripe that must be improved. Guards Aaron Bright, Gabriel Harris, Jarrett Mann and Chasson Randle have all attempted at least 25 free throws. Josh Owens has been a dominant force in the post, but must convert at a higher rate from the line (32-53, 60.4 percent).

### Preseason NIT Runner-Up Finish Fuels Hot Start

Stanford fell just short of upsetting then-No. 5/5 Syracuse on Nov. 25 in the championship game of the Dick's Sporting Goods NIT Season Tip-Off in a 69-63 defeat. Leading 25-24 at halftime and 55-47 with 6:47 left in the game, Stanford was poised to take down its highest-ranked opponent since a 75-68 home win over No. 3/2 UCLA on Jan. 28, 2007. But Syracuse closed the game on a 15-3 run to escape. Stanford won its first three Preseason NIT contests by double digits, knocking down a season-high nine three-pointers in an 82-67 semifinal win over Oklahoma State following West Regional victories over Fresno State and Colorado State.

### Dawkins Inks Three To Letters Of Intent

Head coach Johnny Dawkins announced the signing of three incoming student-athletes to National Letters of Intent. Joining the Cardinal for the 2012-13 campaign are the following: Rosco Allen (Las Vegas, Nev., 6-9, 205-pound forward), Christian Sanders (Houston, Texas, 6-4, 185-pound guard) and Grant Verhoeven (Visalia, Calif., 6-9, 220-pound center). The class is currently ranked as high as No. 25 in the nation by Scout.com.

### Spain Trip Provides Head Start

Stanford embarked on a six-game, 11-day tour of Spain in early September, touring Madrid, Alicante and Barcelona. Stanford played all six games against teams from the ACB League, regarded as the second-best league in the world behind the NBA. Among the opponents: Real Madrid, the 30-time Spanish League and eight-time Euroleague champion, and FC Barcelona Regal, which was playing its first-ever game against a college team and beat the Los Angeles Lakers in an exhibition game last October. Leading Stanford in Spain were Chasson Randle (11.0 points, 2.8 rebounds) and Josh Owens (8.8 points, 4.5 rebounds, 52.6 percent FG).

### Owens Overcomes Adversity To Become Stanford's Leader by Mark Soltau, www.gostanford.com Dec. 20, 2011

When Josh Owens enrolled at Stanford in 2007, little did he anticipate the adversity he would face. The Portsmouth, N.H. native played on Stanford's NCAA Sweet 16 team and thought the sky was the limit for the Cardinal basketball team.

Shortly afterward, head coach Trent Johnson left for LSU and Duke assistant Johnny Dawkins was named The Anne and Tony Joseph Director of Men's Basketball. Owens played in all 34 games as a sophomore, then suffered a serious health challenge and redshirted in 2009-2010.

Last year, Owens rejoined the team and was an honorable mention All-Pac-10 selection, averaging 11.6 points and a team-high 6.5 rebounds. He also led Stanford with 29 blocks, ranked second with 25 steals, and posted 21 double-doubles while shooting 58 percent from the field.

Owens remains a force in the Cardinal frontcourt and has helped fuel a 10-1 start. He averages 12.3 points and 5.1 rebounds per game. A Pac-10 All-Academic honoree last year, Owens has already earned an undergraduate degree and is currently working on his masters in environmental design.

"He's been through a lot," said former teammate and roommate Drew Shiller, now a color analyst on Stanford radio broadcasts. "Freshman year, he sits behind the Lopez Twins, Taj Finger, Peter Prowitt and a bunch of other guys up front; then there is a whole new coaching staff and a complete change in his role; then he has the medical setback that totally took him and everyone by surprise; last year, he had a very solid season but was a little inconsistent at times. It's great to finally see him playing better. He's the main presence inside and it's a presence Stanford needs."
