In just his first three seasons as a head coach at any level, Johnny Dawkins continues to make an impact on one of college basketball's most accomplished programs.

Dawkins' contributions since arriving on The Farm have come in the form of both team and individual successes. One year after leading Stanford to a 20-win season for the 20th time in school history, Dawkins oversaw Landry Fields' progression from key reserve to all-league performer and eventual NBA Draft pick.

Dawkins has also made noticeable strides off the court, as evidenced by the addition of a top-20 recruiting class two years ago and last season's signing of Gatorade Illinois Player of the Year Chasson Randle.

The Cardinal wrapped up the 2010-11 season at 15-16. Fielding a team without a senior for the first time in school history, Dawkins put his rookies in a position to excel, with Anthony Brown and Dwight Powell earning Pac-10 All-Freshman Team honors. In fact, Stanford was represented with four all-league picks.

Stanford finished 14-18 during the 2009-10 campaign in Dawkins' second season at the helm. Working with a roster that featured only seven true scholarship players, two returning starters and six walk-ons, the Cardinal reached the Pac-10 Tournament semifinals.

Under Dawkins' guidance, Fields produced one of the most memorable seasons in school history, earning All-Pac-10 First Team honors after leading the conference in scoring, minutes played, 20-point games and double-doubles while finishing second in rebounding. He was chosen in the second round of the 2010 NBA Draft, as the 39th overall pick by the New York Knicks to become Stanford's 31st NBA/ABA Draft choice and first since Brook Lopez and Robin Lopez in 2008.

During his rookie season in 2008-09, Dawkins directed Stanford to a 20-14 record and reached the CBI semifinals, extending the program's lengthy streaks of consecutive winning seasons (16) and postseason appearances (16). In addition to surpassing Robert Burnett as the winningest first-year head coach in school history, Dawkins ranked third in victories among the 21 first-year head coaches in Division I with no prior college head coaching experience.

Dawkins, 48, became Stanford's 17th head coach on Apr. 28, 2009, after completing 11 years as a member of the Duke coaching staff. For the previous nine seasons (2000-08), Dawkins served as Duke's associate head coach and began his coaching career as an assistant in 1998-99. During Dawkins' 11 years as a coach at Duke, the Blue Devils won a national championship in 2001, six ACC regular season championships and seven ACC Tournament titles.

Dawkins finished his career in 1986 as the school's all-time leading scorer. Dawkins was a two-time first team All-ACC performer in 1985 and 1986 as well as the school's first consensus two-time, first team All-American. During his senior year, he was tabbed ACC Tournament MVP while also becoming the first Naismith Player of the Year recipient in school history.

Scouting Oregon

- Oregon (10-4, 1-1 Pac-12) came away with a road split last weekend, beating Washington State 92-75 in Spokane before falling 76-60 to Washington in Seattle two days later.
- Picked to finish fifth in the Pac-12 preseason media poll, Oregon has won four of its last five overall. The Ducks have yet to lose back-to-back games this year.
- Oregon shot a season-high 69.4 percent overall and 56.3 percent from long range in last week's win over Washington State. However, against Washington, the Ducks made a season-low 32.3 percent overall and 21.7 percent from three-point territory.
- The Ducks are one of the Pac-12's better offensive teams, averaging 70.1 points per game while shooting 45.2 percent overall. Oregon is 8-1 on its home court.
- Look out for: Devoe Joseph (13.4 ppg, 3.0 rpg, 16-42 three-pointers), E.J. Singler (12.8 ppg, 5.3 rpg, 91.7 percent free throws) and Garrett Sim (12.8 ppg, 26-55 three-pointers).

Stanford All-Time vs. Oregon

Stanford holds an 89-45 all-time advantage. The Cardinal has won six of the last 10 meetings overall, with all four losses coming by eight points or less. Last year's season series was split, with Oregon winning its first game at Maples Pavilion since 1986, before Stanford countered with an 88-71 victory at Matthew Knight Arena one month later.

Who To Watch Against Oregon

This could be the game where it clicks for Dwight Powell. In two games last year, Powell averaged 12.5 points and 8.5 rebounds while making 9-16 from the floor. His double-double of 11 points and 11 boards came in the second meeting. Josh Owens has averaged 7.8 points and 5.5 rebounds in five matchups while connecting on 15-22 from the field (68.1 percent).

Scouting Oregon State

- Oregon State (10-4, 0-2 Pac-12) hosts California on Thursday night in Corvallis.
- Picked to finish eighth in the Pac-12 preseason media poll, Oregon State had won four in a row before dropping both of its first two conference games last week.
- The Beavers raced out to a 5-1 start over the first six games. Included in that hot start was a 100-95 overtime win over Texas that created some November buzz.
- Stanford's defense will be tested. Oregon State averages 82.6 points per game and shoots 49.4 percent from the field. Six players are contributing at least 9.0 points per game.
- Keep an eye on: Jared Cunningham (17.0 ppg, 41 steals), Ahmad Starks (13.0 ppg, 95.5 percent free throws), Joe Burton (9.3 ppg, 6.5 rpg, team-high 52 assists).

Stanford All-Time vs. Oregon State

Oregon State owns a 73-62 edge in the all-time series, which dates back to 1915. The last 10 meetings have been split, however the Beavers took two of three last year thanks to a 69-67 victory in the play-in round of the Pac-10 Tournament. Quirky scheduling: Stanford and Oregon State have matched up nine times over the last three seasons combined.

Who To Watch Against Oregon State

Anthony Brown (14.6 ppg, 6.0 rpg) and Dwight Powell (12.5 ppg, 8.5 rpg) made the most of their matchups against Oregon State last year as rookies. In nine contests, Josh Owens has knocked down 21-35 from the field. Jack Trotter has scored more points (29) against the Beavers than any other conference team, while shooting 13-21 in eight meetings.

Knee Injury Sidelines Harris For Season

Junior Gabriel Harris is out for the season after undergoing surgery for an injury to his right knee. In 12 games as a reserve, he averaged 3.6 points and 2.0 rebounds in 13.5 minutes.

Upcoming Schedule Notes

Comcast SportsNet Bay Area (CSNBA) will not televise the Jan. 7 game at Oregon State due to a scheduling conflict. Instead, the game will be shown live on ROOT Sports. Meanwhile, CSNBA has finalized the addition of two other games (Jan. 12 vs. Utah and Feb. 25 at Utah).

Takeaways From The USC Game

- Aaron Bright scored seven of his game-high 16 points over the final 4:43. Bright made 5-10 from the field and connected on all five of his free throw attempts.
- Josh Owens added 12 points on 5-10 shooting and hauled down a team-high nine boards, pacing Stanford to a 32-24 edge on the glass.
- After trailing by eight early, Stanford rallied to take a 31-25 halftime lead. The Cardinal led by 11 with 14:25 remaining before the Trojans whittled it to a 3-point deficit nine minutes later.
- Stanford held an opponent under 60 points for the 10th time this year. The Trojans connected on just 34.8 percent shooting while leading scorer Maurice Jones was 1-12 from the field.
- Stanford has now made at least one three-pointer in 332 consecutive games, dating back to a 0-6 performance against Purdue in the John Wooden Tradition on Nov. 24, 2001.

We Liked The New Digs

Stanford's offense was impressive last February in its first-ever appearance at Oregon's Matthew Knight Arena, resulting in an 88-71 win. The 88 points and 59.3 percent shooting were the best marks produced by a Pac-10 opponent in the first year of the facility. Overall, it was a much better showing than the last time Stanford played a "first game" in a Pac-10 arena. When Stanford made its debut at USC's Galen Center for the first time on Feb. 22, 2007, the Cardinal were beaten 69-65 and shot 40.7 percent overall and 29.4 percent from long range.

Back-To-Back 2-0 Starts A Rarity

Stanford has started conference play 2-0 for the second consecutive season, following up last year's effort in which the Cardinal defeated California and Arizona State. This marks the first time Stanford has started 2-0 in league play in back-to-back seasons since winning its first two games in 1998 (Oregon State, Oregon) and 1999 (Oregon State, Oregon).

Shot Distribution Evenly Balanced

The Cardinal has demonstrated effective "inside-out" play through the first two months, with four of its primary starters attempting nearly the same number of shots. Four different players are averaging between 106-115 field goal attempts in what has proven to be an extremely balanced offensive system.

Close Calls

The 60-59 win over UCLA last Thursday represented only the second one-point victory in four seasons under head coach Johnny Dawkins. The only other one-point triumph since the start of the 2008-09 campaign came back on Jan. 6, 2010, when Stanford defeated USC 54-53 at home.

Road Unkind In Conference Play

Stanford is just 6-21 on the road in Pac-10 play dating back to the 2008-09 campaign. The Cardinal was 3-6 in league action last year, booking wins at Arizona State, Washington State and Oregon. Stanford swept its Oregon/Oregon State road trip in 2010 to finish 2-7 on the road in conference play, following a 1-8 mark in Pac-10 road games during the 2009 season.

Stingy Defense Setting The Tone

Stanford has allowed only 56.5 points per game, a figure that ranks second in the Pac-12 and 15th in the nation. The Cardinal has limited 10 of its 14 opponents to under 60 points. In fact, it's really been a challenge for the opposition to score from anywhere on the court, as Stanford's foes are shooting 39.5 percent from the field, 32.0 percent from beyond the arc and 61.2 percent from the foul line.

Winning The Rebound Battle

Stanford has owned a commanding edge on the glass, averaging 37.6 rebounds per game compared to just 29.7 by its opponents. The Cardinal's rebounding margin (+7.9) ranks ninth in the country. Six different players are averaging at least 3.0 rebounds, with Josh Owens grabbing a team-high 5.9 per game. Stanford has been outrebounded only twice so far.

Balanced Scoring A Trademark

Through 14 games, 10 different players have already notched double-digit scoring efforts. That's already equal to last year, when 10 players reached double figures in scoring at least once for the entire season. Five players scored in double figures during each of Stanford's first two games, representing the first time at least five players scored in double figures in back-to-back games since the first two contests of the 2007-08 campaign.

Winning Often, Winning Big

Stanford has made a habit of dominating its opponents in the early going, with the Cardinal boasting a scoring margin of +14.9 that leads the Pac-12. Nine of Stanford's 11 victories have come by double digits, while five have been decided by at least 20 points.

Plenty Of Minutes To Go Around

Head coach Johnny Dawkins has the benefit of employing a rotation that can consistently run 10-12 players deep. Ten players are averaging at least 10.0 minutes of court time, with Jack Trotter right on the cusp of bumping that total to 11 with his 8.0 minutes per game.

Aggressiveness Resulting In Line Opportunities

Stanford has attempted 316 free throws compared to 224 by its opponents. However, the Cardinal has made only 218 of those freebies, translating into a 69.0 percent clip from the charity stripe that must be improved. Guards Aaron Bright, Jarrett Mann and Chasson Randle have all attempted at least 36 free throws. Josh Owens has been a dominant force in the post, but must convert at a higher rate from the line (35-57, 61.4 percent).

Preseason NIT Runner-Up Finish Fuels Hot Start

Stanford fell just short of upsetting then-No. 5/5 Syracuse on Nov. 25 in the championship game of the Dick's Sporting Goods NIT Season Tip-Off in a 69-63 defeat. Leading 25-24 at halftime and 55-47 with 6:47 left in the game, Stanford was poised to take down its highest-ranked opponent since a 75-68 home win over No. 3/2 UCLA on Jan. 28, 2007. But Syracuse closed the game on a 15-3 run to escape. Stanford won its first three Preseason NIT contests by double digits, knocking down a season-high nine three-pointers in an 82-67 semifinal win over Oklahoma State following West Regional victories over Fresno State and Colorado State.

Dawkins Inks Three To Letters Of Intent

Head coach Johnny Dawkins announced the signing of three incoming student-athletes to National Letters of Intent. Joining the Cardinal for the 2012-13 campaign are the following: Rosco Allen (Las Vegas, Nev., 6-9, 205-pound forward), Christian Sanders (Houston, Texas, 6-4, 185-pound guard) and Grant Verhoeven (Visalia, Calif., 6-9, 220-pound center). The class is currently ranked as high as No. 25 in the nation by Scout.com.

Spain Trip Provides Head Start

Stanford embarked on a six-game, 11-day tour of Spain in early September, touring Madrid, Alicante and Barcelona. Stanford played all six games against teams from the ACB League, regarded as the second-best league in the world behind the NBA. Among the opponents: Real Madrid, the 30-time Spanish League and eight-time Euroleague champion, and FC Barcelona Regal, which was playing its first-ever game against a college team and beat the Los Angeles Lakers in an exhibition game last October. Leading Stanford in Spain were Chasson Randle (11.0 points, 2.8 rebounds) and Josh Owens (8.8 points, 4.5 rebounds, 52.6 percent FG).

Home Sweet Home

Stanford is 60-17 at home since the start of the 2007-08 campaign. The Cardinal was 11-5 at home last year, reaching the 10-win mark at Maples Pavilion for the 18th straight year.

Who Will Step Up?

Stanford is assured of having a different scoring leader for the 11th straight season, with Josh Owens a potential candidate as his 11.6 points per game clip leads all returnees. Jeremy Green closed out the 2010-11 season with a team-best 16.7 points per game, following Landry Fields (22.0 ppg in 2009-10), Anthony Goods (16.2 ppg in 2008-09), Brook Lopez (19.3 ppg in 2007-08), Lawrence Hill (15.7 ppg in 2006-07), Matt Haryasz (16.2 ppg in 2005-06), Dan Grunfeld (17.9 ppg in 2004-05), Josh Childress (15.7 ppg in 2003-04), Julius Barnes (16.0 ppg in 2002-03) and Casey Jacobsen (21.9 ppg in 2001-02).

Stanford Holds Off USC 51-43

Stanford looked to its smallest player to make the biggest plays Saturday in a 51-43 victory over USC to open the Pacific-12 Conference season by sweeping the Los Angeles schools at Maples Pavilion.

Aaron Bright, a 5-foot-11 sophomore, scored the Cardinal's final seven points after the Trojans closed to 44-41 with 6:15 left to help Stanford end the year upbeat.

"I try not to do anything forced," he said. "But if we're having a hard time scoring, I want to at least try to make something happen."

Bright led all scorers with 16 points while shooting 50 percent from the field. His only 3-pointer might have been his biggest. Bright buried the shot with 4:08 left for an eight-point lead.

While Bright got hot at the end, USC missed its final four shots and never recovered.

"We're right there in every game," USC coach Kevin O'Neill said. "We could play a bunch of midgets or the New York Knicks to a one-possession game -- we're just not winning games."

Stanford is on a different road. The Cardinal has shown tremendous growth since ushering in five freshmen last season. No one has made a bigger leap than Bright.

"He has been getting better and better," coach Johnny Dawkins said. "He's an emotional guy who is going to do what he can do to help."

The point guard hopes to help more after failing to get an assist on Saturday.

"That's my biggest flaw right now," Bright said. "I'm doing dumb stuff with the ball a little bit."

USC had a lot to do with it. Dawkins said it was the best defense the Cardinal has faced this season. The Trojans entered the game holding opponents to 55.8 points per game.

After getting torched by UCLA's Lazeric Jones (26 points) on Thursday night, the Cardinal guards did a better job of keeping up with the Trojans' Jones -- Maurice. USC's leading scorer (15.1 ppg) made 1 of 12 field goal attempts and had five points.

Stanford Beats UCLA In Pac-12 Opener

Stanford forward Josh Huestis finally figured out how to stop UCLA guard Lazeric Jones from scoring Thursday night - don't let the shot get to the basket.

Huestis blocked Jones' shot with three seconds remaining and the Cardinal held on for a 60-59 victory in the Pac-12 conference opener for both teams in front of 6,777 at Maples Pavilion.

Jones scored a career-high 26 points on 8-for-13 shooting, but with the game hanging in the balance, Huestis came up with the defensive play of the game.

"He had been hitting all game so I knew they wanted him to take the last shot," Huestis said. "There were a lot of possible scenarios going through my head because he had barely missed at all. I don't think he was ready to give it up. The way he was playing, I can't really blame him."

UCLA center Joshua Smith scored on a putback to begin the game, the only time the Bruins led. But after trimming an 11-point deficit to 24-23 at halftime, UCLA didn't trail by more than five points in the second half. The Bruins tied it up on five occasions and each time Stanford answered with a score on its next possession.

"It's important for our group," Stanford coach Johnny Dawkins said. "We're still trying to build leadership and for those kids to be in a game like this and to learn how to close is huge for this team."

It's only one night of conference play, but a win over the team that was the preseason pick to win the Pac-12 title helped the Cardinal validate its impressive nonconference performance. After a sluggish start to the season, UCLA entered Thursday on a five-game winning streak.
