## Stanford to Face Oklahoma State in Tostitos Fiesta Bowl

### Cardinal Making Second Straight BCS Bowl Appearance

#### The Game

The Stanford Cardinal (11-1, 8-1 Pac-12 North) will meet the Oklahoma State Cowboys (11-1, 8-1 Big 12) in the **41st Annual Tostitos Fiesta Bowl** on January 2, 2012 at University of Phoenix Stadium in Glendale, Ariz. Kickoff is set for 5:30 p.m. PT and the game will be televised by ESPN. The Cardinal is making its third straight bowl appearance and 23rd overall. It also marks Stanford's second straight BCS Bowl appearance after the Cardinal defeated Virginia Tech in last year's Discover Orange Bowl. Stanford was ranked fourth in the final BCS standings while Oklahoma State was ranked third.

#### Television/Radio Plans

The Tostitos Fiesta Bowl will be televised by ESPN and will be carried live on Stanford's flagship station, KNBR 680 AM, with **Dave Flemming** (play-by-play), **Todd Husak** (analyst) and **John Platz** (sidelines) handling the broadcasting duties. All radio broadcasts begin one hour prior to kickoff with the Cardinal Tailgate Show and will conclude with the Cardinal Locker Room Report following the game. Stanford student station KZSU will also broadcast the Fiesta Bowl. All Stanford radio broadcasts can also be heard on GoStanford.com via the All-Access player.

#### Stanford-Oklahoma State Series

The Tostitos Fiesta Bowl will mark the first ever meeting between Stanford and Oklahoma State. Stanford is 5-7 against teams that are currently aligned in the Big 12 Conference (1-0 Kansas; 1-0 Missouri; 1-4 Oklahoma; 2-2 Texas; 0-1 Texas A&M). The last time Stanford played a Big 12 team was in the 2009 Sun Bowl, where the Cardinal dropped a 31-27 decision to Oklahoma.

#### Cardinal Clips

- Finished the regular season with an 11-1 (8-1 Pac-12 North) overall mark...had won its first nine games of the season and 17 in a row before suffering its first loss of the season to Oregon on Nov. 12.
- Has posted back-to-back 11-win seasons for the first time in program history...marks Stanford's fifth season of posting at least 10 wins in program history.
- Ranked No. 4 by AP and USA Today Coaches polls...also ranked No. 4 in the BCS standings...have been ranked in the Top 10 of the AP poll for 22 straight weeks, marking the program's longest run as a Top 10 team in school history.
- Has posted a 36-14 (.720) record since 2008 and are 31-7 (.816) dating back to the 2009 campaign.
- Making its third-straight bowl appearance following showings in the 2009 Sun Bowl and 2011 Orange Bowl...last time Stanford made three straight bowl appearances was from 1934-36, when the Indians made Rose Bowl appearances following the 1933, '34 and '35 seasons.
- Is 10-11-1 in 22 previous bowl appearances, with more than half (12) of its total bowl appearances coming in the Rose Bowl.
- Rank second in the Pac-12 and fifth nationally in scoring, averaging 43.58 points a game...has scored 40 or more points 17 times in the last 38 games dating back to the 2009 season...averaging 41.9 ppg (1,047 total) over the last 25 contests...with 523 points, will likely break last year's school scoring record of 524.
- Have scored 30 or more points in 14 of its last 15 games dating back to last season and has scored 40 or more in nine of the 15 games.
- Rank second in the Pac-12 and 22nd nationally in rushing offense at 207.9...rushed for a school-record 446 yards against Washington.
- Offense has had just 13 three-and-outs all season.
- Leads the Pac-12 in five defensive categories -- total defense (331.42), rushing defense (93.3), red zone defense (74.0), third down conversion defense (47-142; 30.92) and fewest first downs per game (17.75)...rank second in sacks-per-game (3.17), scoring defense (20.33), and tackles-for-loss (7.33).
- Defense has held the opponent to just 28 points in the first quarter and just 47 points in the third quarter this season.
- Has outscored its last 23 opponents 531-193 in the first half...have led or been tied at the half in 25 of the last 26 games.
- Has trailed in just three games this season -- USC, Oregon and Cal.
- Have come away with points in 63 of 64 (98.0) trips to the red zone this season (50 TDs, 13 FGs)...rank first nationally in red zone offense.
- Andrew Luck holds Stanford career records for passing TDs (80), total offense (10,043), completion percentage (.661) and passing efficiency (161.7)...with 35 TDs this season, he broke his own single-season school, record of 32 set last season...Stanford is 31-6 (.838) in Luck's 37 career starts.

**Shaw Quick Facts**

- Named Bradford M. Freeman Director of Football on January 13, 2011, becoming the 34th head coach in Stanford history.
- Named Pac-12 Conference Coach of the Year in his first season.
- He is the fifth alum to hold the position of head football coach, joining Charles Fickert (1901), Carl Clemans (1902), Chuck Taylor (1951-57) and Paul Wiggan (1980-83).
- Four-year letterwinner (wide receiver) at Stanford from 1991-94...member of Stanford's 1991 Aloha Bowl team coached by Denny Green...also was a member of the Cardinal's 1992 Blockbuster Bowl-winning team coached by Bill Walsh...finished his career with 57 catches for 664 yards and five TDs.
- Earned his degree in sociology.
- Previously served as Stanford's offensive coordinator for past four seasons (2007-10)...Stanford set school scoring records each of the past two seasons...team scored 40 or more points in 11 games during his time as offensive coordinator.
- Play-calling ability in the red zone helped Stanford convert on a national-best 57.6 percent of its chances inside the 20-yard line.
- Tutored five running backs that combined for the second-highest rushing total (2,063 yards) in school history in 2010.
- Prior to his appointment at Stanford, served as wide receivers and passing game coordinator at the University of San Diego, where he helped guide the nation's top Division I-AA offense that paced the Toreros to the Pioneer League championship and NCAA Division I-AA Mid Major title.
- Coaching resume also includes nine years of NFL experience with the Philadelphia Eagles (1997), Oakland Raiders (1998-2001) and Baltimore Ravens (2002-05).
- David's father, Willie, had two separate coaching stints at Stanford (1974-76; 1989-91) during his 33-year coaching career, which also included stops with the Detroit Lions, Kansas City Chiefs, Minnesota Vikings, New Orleans Saints, Oakland Raiders, San Diego Chargers and St. Louis Rams.
- Union City, Calif.-native was born in San Diego... wife Kori...three children--Keegan, Carter and Gavin.

## Stanford Notebook

### Stanford to Meet Oklahoma State in Tostitos Fiesta Bowl

Stanford (11-1, 8-1 Pac-12 North) will face Big 12 champion Oklahoma State Cowboys (11-1, 8-1 Big 12) in the 41st Annual Tostitos Fiesta Bowl on Monday, January 2 at University of Phoenix Stadium in Glendale, Ariz. Game time is set for 5:30 p.m. PT and the game will be televised on ESPN.

Stanford is ranked fourth nationally in the AP, USA Today and BCS Standings while Oklahoma State holds down the third spot in the same polls.

The Cardinal is making its second straight BCS bowl appearance and third overall, after showings in the 2000 Rose Bowl and 2011 Orange Bowl.

### Stanford's Bowl History

Stanford is making its third straight bowl appearance and 23rd overall. The Cardinal is 10-11-1 in 22 previous bowl games and 3-6 in its last nine bowl appearances dating back to the 1986 Gator Bowl.

This also marks the Cardinal's third BCS bowl appearance, including the 2000 Rose Bowl and last year's Discover Orange Bowl.

The last time Stanford made three straight bowl appearances was from 1934-36, when the Indians made Rose Bowl appearances following the 1933, '34 and '35 seasons.

Stanford's previous 22 bowl appearances have included 12 trips to the Rose Bowl (1901, 1925, 1927, 1928, 1934, 1935, 1936, 1941, 1952, 1971, 1972 and 2001), three trips to the Sun Bowl (1977, 1996 and 2009) and one trip each to the Bluebonnet (1978), Gator (1986), Aloha (1991), Blockbuster (1993), Liberty (1995), Seattle (2001) and Orange (2011) Bowls.

Stanford defeated Virginia Tech, 40-12 in last year's Discover Orange Bowl.

### First Time Foes

Stanford and Oklahoma State will be meeting for the first time at the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl. The two schools have played and defeated one common opponent this season -- Arizona -- with the Cardinal posting a 37-10 victory in Tucson on Sept. 17 while the Cowboys scored a 37-14 win in Stillwater the week before.

Stanford is 5-7 all-time against teams currently aligned in the Big 12 Conference. Its last game against a Big 12 school came in the 2009 Sun Bowl, when it dropped a 31-27 decision to Oklahoma.

### Back-to-Back 11-Win Seasons

Stanford has won 11 regular season games for the second straight season following last year's campaign, when the Cardinal brought an 11-1 record into the Discover Orange Bowl, where it defeated Virginia Tech to finish 12-1 on the year. This is the first time in program history the Cardinal has posted back-to-back 11-win seasons. It's Stanford's fifth season of posting at least 10 wins, including 1926 (10-0-1), 1940 (10-0-0), 1992 (10-3-0) and 2010 (12-1).

### The Polls

Stanford finished the regular season ranked fourth in both the AP and USA Today Coaches polls. The Cardinal was also ranked fourth in the final BCS Standings.

Stanford was ranked as high as No. 3 in the AP poll on Nov. 6, marking its highest regular season AP ranking since 1970, when the Indians were ranked No. 3 heading into an Oct. 3 game against Purdue, which it lost, 26-14.

Stanford has been ranked in the AP poll for 28 consecutive weeks since the Sept. 5th poll of 2010, marking the program's longest continuous stay in the AP poll since the 1969-72 seasons, when the program spent 43 consecutive weeks in the Top 20.

Stanford has been ranked in the Top 10 of the AP poll for 21 consecutive weeks dating back to last season, marking the Cardinal's longest run as a Top 10 team in school history (previous was eight in 1940).

### Stanford vs. Ranked Opponents

Stanford is 8-2 in its last 10 games against ranked opponents, including a 3-1 mark this season. After posting wins over No. 22 Washington and No. 20 USC in consecutive weekends, the Cardinal fell to No. 6 Oregon on Nov. 12, ending its four-game winning streak against ranked opponents. Stanford downed No. 22 Notre Dame in its final regular season game, 28-14.

Stanford was 3-0 against ranked opponents in 2009, defeating No. 24 Washington (31-14), No. 7 Oregon (51-42) and No. 11 USC (55-21) and 2-1 vs. Top 25 foes last season, with wins over No. 13 Arizona (42-17) and No. 12 Virginia Tech after losing to No. 4 Oregon (52-31).

### Successful Stretch

The Cardinal has posted a 36-14 (.720) record over the last four seasons, finishing 5-7 in 2008, 8-5 in '09, 12-1 last season -- along with this year's 11-1 mark.

The Cardinal has also posted a 22-5 (.815) record in conference play over the last three seasons (6-3 in 2009; 8-1 in '10; 8-1 in '11). The 21 conference wins over the last three seasons rank second only to Oregon's 25 during that same period.

Stanford has secured its third straight winning season, marking the first time the Cardinal strung together three straight winning campaigns since 1968-78, when it recorded 11 consecutive winning seasons.

**The Home Record**

Stanford 23-3 in its last 26 home contests dating back to the final home contest of the 2007 season, with its only losses coming against USC (2008), Cal (2009) and Oregon (2011) during that stretch. The Cardinal had won 11 straight home games prior to its 53-30 loss to Oregon on Nov. 12.

In seven home games this season, Stanford outscored its opposition 304-145. The Cardinal posted a 6-0 record at home last season, marking the program's first undefeated home season since 1977 and ninth all-time at Stanford Stadium (1924, '26, '30, '33, '34, '40, '69, '77, '10).

The Cardinal is averaging 40.0 points a game (1,000 total) over its last 25 home games (2008-11) while allowing 21.7 (544).

**High-Scoring Cardinal**

The Cardinal is averaging 43.58 points (523 total) and ranks second in the Pac-12 and fifth nationally in scoring average, trailing only Houston (50.77), Oklahoma State (49.33), Oregon (46.15) and Wisconsin (44.62) among the national leaders.

Stanford has scored 40 or more points 17 times in its last 38 games dating back to the 2009 season and has scored 50 or more seven times during that same stretch. The team is averaging 41.9 (1,047 total) points over its last 25 contests.

Stanford's current point total of 523 is one shy of the school's all-time scoring record, established by last year's team. The Cardinal has posted the school's top three scoring marks in each of the last three seasons.

**Defensive Doings**

Stanford ranks either first or second in the Pac-12 in eight defensive categories, including rushing defense (1st; 93.33), red zone defense (1st; 74.0), third down conversion percentage (1st; 30.92; 47-142), total defense (1st; 331.42), fewest first downs per game (1st; 17.75), sacks-per-game (2nd; 3.17), scoring defense (2nd; 20.33) and tackles-for-loss (7.33).

The Cardinal's rushing defense ranks fifth nationally and it also ranks in the top-25 nationally in third down conversion percentage (6th), sacks per game (6th), tackles-for-loss per game (12th), red zone defense (15th) total defense (25th) and fewest first downs allowed (t-25th).

Stanford's defense has allowed just 300 points in its last 18 contests (16.7) dating back to last season, with 153 of the 286 points coming in three games against Oregon (105) and USC (48).

Stanford has limited 15 of its last 18 opponents to 21 points or fewer. The Cardinal has held the opposition to 10 points or fewer five times in the last 18 games.

**Scoring First**

Stanford has scored first in 23 of its last 26 games dating back to last season. The Cardinal has come away with points on its first drives in 16 of its last 26 games (9 FGs, 7 TDs). Stanford has trailed in just three games this season (USC, Oregon and Cal).

**Moving the Chains**

Stanford's offense has had just 13 three-and-outs all season. The Cardinal has punted just 35 times, which is tied with Georgia Tech for the fourth fewest punt attempts in the nation behind Baylor (30), Army (32), Navy (33) and Air Force (33). In addition, Stanford ranks first in the Pac-12 Conference and fifth nationally in third down conversion percentage (52.17; 84-161) and ranks 10th nationally in first downs per game (24.83).

**Red Zone Efficiency**

Stanford ranks first nationally in red zone efficiency percentage, having cashed in on 63 of 64 attempts (98.0) in the red zone this season (48 TDs, 13 FGs). Stanford had converted its first 58 trips to the red zone to start the season.

**Turnover Margin**

Stanford ranks fourth in the Pac-12 Conference in turnover margin at +6 (21-15). The Cardinal has forced 21 turnovers (15 fumbles; 6 interceptions) while turning the ball over just 15 times (6 fumbles; 9 interceptions). Stanford committed the fewest turnovers in the Pac-12 Conference.

**First Half Advantage**

Stanford has outscored its last 25 opponents 531-193 in the first half, including 230-103 this season. The Cardinal has outscored its opposition 301-90 in the first half last season and 267-156 in 2009. The Cardinal has led or been tied at the half in 25 of its last 26 games, with the lone exception coming against Oregon this season, when Stanford trailed, 22-16 at intermission.

## Scoring Margins

Stanford has won 11 of its last 14 games by 25 points or more and its average margin of victory in its last 14 games has been by 28.8 points (403 total).

Prior to its eight point, overtime victory over USC, Stanford had won 10 straight games by 25 points or more, which was a school-record and the longest streak of its kind in college football since 1936.

Stanford's last 31 victories dating back to the 2009 season have come by a margin of 24.8 (770 total) points, while its six losses have been by a margin of just 8.8 points (53 total). Stanford is 9-8 in its last 17 games decided by a touchdown or less.

## Controlling the Clock

Stanford has won the time of possession in 21 of its last 25 games dating back to last season. The Cardinal ranks first in the Pac-12 and ninth nationally in time of possession, holding the ball for an average of 33.07 per game. Stanford led the nation last year in time of possession, holding the ball for an average of 34:34 per game.

## What a Rush

The Cardinal ranks second in the Pac-12 and 22nd nationally in rushing offense, averaging 207.92 yards per game -- despite not having a back who is averaging 100.0 yards per game.

The Cardinal features three backs -- **Stepfan Taylor** (96.1), **Tyler Gaffney** (37.1) and **Anthony Wilkerson** (23.6) -- who are averaging 23.0 yards or more per game. Taylor ranks fifth in the conference behind Oregon's LaMichael James (149.6), Utah's John White (117.0), Washington's Chris Polk (111.8) and Cal's Isi Sofele (105.8) in rushing average.

Taylor (8), **Jeremy Stewart** (8) and Gaffney (7) have accounted for 23 of the team's 29 rushing touchdowns.

Stanford rushed for a school-record 446 yards on 44 carries against Washington, breaking the previous single-game record of 439 yards, set at Oregon State in 1981. The rushing total of 446 yards marked the fourth-best rushing performance on the season among FBS teams. Taylor (138) and Gaffney (career-high 117) rushed for more than 100 yards, marking the 10th time in school history two Stanford backs had rushed for 100 or more yards in the same game. **Toby Gerhart** (116) and **Anthony Kimble** (110) were the last duo to accomplish the feat at Arizona, in 2008.

Stanford has recorded four of the school's top five rushing marks over the last four seasons, rushing for a school-record 2,837 yards in 2009, 2,779 yards last season and 2,395 yards in 2008. The team's current rushing total of 2,495 yards ranks as the third highest total in school history.

## Run-First Offense

Of Stanford's 854 plays from scrimmage this season, 468 (54.8) have been running plays while 386 (45.1) have been pass plays. Since 2009, Stanford has rushed the ball on 59.7 percent of its offensive plays (1539-2576).

## Luck in Stanford's Record Books

Quarterback **Andrew Luck** currently ranks third all-time among Stanford quarterbacks with 9,083 passing yards, trailing only **Steve Stenstrom** (10,531) and John Elway (9,349) on the school's all-time list.

His four touchdown passes against Notre Dame ran his career total to 80, moving him past John Elway (77) into first place on Stanford's all-time career list. His 35 touchdown passes broke his own single-season record of 32 set last year.

Luck also ranks first all-time in total offense with 10,043 yards, completion percentage (.664) and passing efficiency (161.7).

## Luck Ranks as Stanford's All-Time Winningest Quarterback

Stanford is 31-6 (.838) with **Andrew Luck** as its starting quarterback. Luck's 31 wins as a starter are the most all-time among Stanford quarterbacks, ahead of **Steve Stenstrom** (24) and **Jim Plunkett** (22).

Luck's .838 career winning percentage also ranks first all-time among Stanford quarterbacks and is second to Boise State's **Kellen Moore** among active FBS signal callers.

## Luck Among Active Leaders

**Andrew Luck** ranks in the top-10 among active quarterbacks in various statistical categories, including passing efficiency (3rd; 161.76), passing touchdowns (7th; 80) and completion percentage (10th; .664). He also ranks among the top-15 in total offense per game (11th; 271.4) touchdowns responsible for (11th; 87), passing yards (11th; 9,083) and total offense (11th; 10,043).

## Go-To Tight Ends

Tight ends **Coby Fleener** (10), **Levine Toilolo** (6) and **Zach Ertz** (3) have accounted for more than half (19 of 36) of Stanford's touchdown receptions this season, with the others being distributed among **Ryan Hewitt** (5), **Griff Whalen** (4), **Chris Owusu** (2), **Stepfan Taylor** (2), **Jeremy Stewart** (1), **Drew Terrell** (1) and **Ty Montgomery** (1).

Going back to last year's Orange Bowl win over Virginia Tech, tight ends have combined to catch 23 of Stanford's last 39 touchdown passes. Fleener (18), Ertz (8) and Toilolo (6) have combined for 32 career touchdown receptions.

This season, Stanford's tight end trio of Fleener, Ertz and Toilolo have combined for 79 receptions totaling 1,281 yards (16.2), including 19 touchdowns. The yardage total accounts for 39.1 percent of the team's receiving yardage (3,276).

## Finding Fleener

First team All-Pac-12 selection **Coby Fleener** is averaging 20.2 yards (32-648) per catch this season and 15.9 yards per catch (94-1,524) in his 50 career games. Fleener's 19 career touchdown receptions rank first all-time among Stanford tight ends and are tied for fifth on the school's all-time career list with **Tony Hill** (1973-76) and **Vincent White** (1979-82). He needs two more TDs to tie **Justin Armour** (1991-94) for fourth place.

## Taylor's Tale

With 1,153 rushing yards this season, **Stepfan Taylor** is just the third back in school history to rush for 1,000 yards in consecutive seasons, joining **Darrin Nelson** (1977-78) and **Toby Gerhart** (2008-09).

The junior from Mansfield, Texas, has rushed for 100 yards or more 12 times in his career. His 12 100-yard games rank third all-time behind **Toby Gerhart** (20) and Nelson (16).

His career rushing total of 2,593 yards ranks fourth on Stanford's all-time career charts while his 25 rushing touchdowns are tied for fourth. He needs just one more rushing TD to tie **Brad Muster** (1984-87) for third all-time. **Toby Gerhart** (2006-09) holds the school's all-time record for rushing touchdowns with 44.

## Good Griff

Senior wide receiver **Griff Whalen** has caught a team-high 49 passes for 664 yards and four touchdowns on the year to ranks as Stanford's leading receiver. Coming into the season, Whalen had caught 24 passes for 309 yards and one touchdown in 26 career games. His nine receptions for 107 yards against Oregon were career highs. The Sylvania, Ohio, native was a finalist for the Bursworth Trophy, awarded to the top player on college football who began his career as a walk-on.

## The O-Line

Stanford's offensive line consisting of center **Sam Schwartzstein**, right guard **David DeCastro**, right tackle **Cameron Fleming**, left tackle **Jonathan Martin** and left guard **David Yankey** has allowed the sixth fewest sacks (tie) in the nation (0.75; 9 total) while paving the way for a Cardinal running game to average 207.92 yards per game on the ground.

Stanford's offensive line has allowed just 24 sacks over the last three seasons while paving the way for a ground game to average 213.4 yards per game (8,111 in 38).

## Best Foot Forward

**Jordan Williamson** (12-15) and **Eric Whitaker** (4-5) are a combined 16 for 20 in field-goal attempts this season. Over the last four seasons, Stanford kickers have combined to make 63-of-78 (.808) of their field-goal attempts.

Over the last two seasons, Stanford kickers have missed more PATS (8) than field goals (6).

## Plus Plays

Of fullback's **Ryan Hewitt's** 43 touches this season, 30 have either resulted in first downs (25) or touchdowns (5).

## First Time Starters

With wide receiver Ty Montgomery making his first career start against Oregon, Stanford has featured 17 first-time starters this season. The list includes LG **David Yankey**, C **Sam Schwartzstein**, RT **Cameron Fleming**, FB **Ryan Hewitt**, NG **Terrence Stephens**, DE **Ben Gardner**, OLB **Trent Murphy**, K **Jordan Williamson**, SS **Devon Carrington**, ILB **Jarek Lancaster**, CB **Terrence Brown**, ILB **A.J. Tarpley**, CB **Jordan Richards**, FB **Geoff Meinken**, K **Eric Whitaker**, RT **Tyler Mabry** and Montgomery.

## Hot Ticket

Earning second team honors were running back **Stepfan Taylor**, defensive end **Ben Gardner** and kicker **Jordan Williamson**.

Honorable mention selections included **Max Bergen** (special teams), offensive lineman **Cameron Fleming**, fullback **Ryan Hewitt**, defensive end **Matt Masifilo**, **Ty Montgomery** (special teams), **Drew Terrell** (return specialist), defensive back **Michael Thomas**, tight end **Levine Toilolo** and offensive lineman **David Yankey**.

### Shaw Named Pac-12 Conference's Coach of the Year

Bradford M. Freeman Director of Football **David Shaw** was selected as the Pac-12 Conference's Coach of the Year after guiding Stanford to an 11-1 regular season record in his first season at the helm of the Cardinal program. Under his leadership, the Cardinal has been ranked in the Top 10 of the AP poll for a school-record 22 consecutive weeks and was ranked as high as No. 2 in the USA Today Coaches poll on Nov. 6.

He is the third Stanford head coach to receive the award, following **Bill Walsh** (1977) and **Tyrone Willingham** (1995 and '99).

### All-America Watch

Three Stanford players -- quarterback **Andrew Luck**, right guard **David DeCastro** and left tackle **Jonathan Martin** -- have been named to various All-America teams. All three players landed spots on the Walter Camp Football Foundation All-America squad, with Luck being named the 2011 Walter Camp Player of the Year. Luck and DeCastro were also named to the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) All-America squad, while DeCastro earned a spot on the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) All-America team.

Offensive linemen **Cameron Fleming** and **David Yankey** were named freshmen All-Americans by Yahoo! Sports, while tight end **Coby Fleener** garnered second team All-America honors by Yahoo!

### Luck Garners National Player of the Year Awards

Stanford quarterback **Andrew Luck** was named the Walter Camp Football Foundation's Player of the Year and also was the recipient of the Maxwell Award as the top player in college football. Both awards were presented at the ESPN Home Depot College Football Awards Show in Orlando, Fla.

He is the second Stanford player to earn Walter Camp Player of the Year honors, following **Jim Plunkett's** selection in 1970.

### Luck Named Recipient of Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award
